Of Seders and a Certain Bat Mitzvah

The central obligation of Passover is to tell the story of how we journey from slavery to freedom. At seder tables all over the world, we tell that story in a myriad of ways; through narrative, song, symbolic foods, rituals, prayers, play-acting, observations, and questions. The seder is pedagogic genius, designed to hold our attention through engagement of heart, mind, body, and soul.

Even so, it is interesting that we never seem to tire of it. It is, after all, the same story every year. But, surveys consistently show that Passover observance is the most practiced of all Jewish traditions. Large numbers of Jewish families who are otherwise marginally connected, and even a growing number of non-Jews, all report experiencing a Passover seder year after year.

What makes the seder so compelling? Part of the answer is that so much revolves around food! But, I believe it is also because it happens at a meal that is not only about food. Time is drawn out at a seder, the purposeful lingering before and after the meal at the table is so different from the way we generally gather for dinner. Within that stretched out time, we can make observations (remember that is exactly what the "4 questions" are supposed to allow us to do) about how though the story we tell remains the same, we ourselves have gone through much change in a year's time. Because we and our fellow participants are continually on a journey that in many ways mirrors our ancestors', the story is alive for us as well.

I remember my daughter Zoey's first seder, when I was late getting to Boston from

New York because I had been involved in a protest against police brutality. Another seder, we gathered with a group of families with young children at CRC and Zoey freaked out when we brought out the inflatable Screamer in an attempt to playfully represent the plagues. Of course, I remember her gleefully hunting for the afikomen, and the first time she put her Hebrew knowledge to work and chanted the Four Questions. Just recently, Zoey began to understand the empathic nature of this holiday and relate the ancient story of oppression to current events and people who are still not free today.

I know we all have these spiral memories. Passover allows us to merge the familial with the communal, the spiritual with the political. Our drama and the drama of the Hagaddah become one. This year, Passover will be Zoey's last before her bat mitzvah, and the part of the story involving years in the wilderness yearning to find the Promised Land will take on additional meaning for our new teenager!

So, besides hoping to entice you to participate in a seder or two this year, **I want to make sure you know you are most welcome to join my family for services and lunch on May 5th as Zoey becomes a Bat Mitzvah with this amazing community in which she has grown up.** Let us continue to journey together.

Raise the Wage/Cap the Rate

Every day, thousands of families in Missouri struggle to stretch their wages across mounting bills. CRC regularly encounters working families who lack the income to meet their basic needs. As the financial woes for these families mount, many turn to high interest credit, like payday and car title loans, to meet their short term credit needs. The combination of low wages and predatory interest contributes to a system that can trap low-wage workers in a cycle of poverty.

Combating poverty and working for economic justice have long been high priorities for CRC's social responsibility work. For that reason, CRC's Board of Directors has voted to endorse a pair of ballot initiatives intended to give

working families a better chance at economic stability. The first would raise Missouri's minimum wage by \$1.00, from \$7.25 an hour to \$8.25 an hour. The second would cap the interest rates payday lending companies can charge at 36% APR, down from an average of 445% APR currently.

Now through May 1, a coalition of faith- and community-based organizations is working to collect signatures to put these two initiatives on the November 2012 ballot. We encourage all CRC members to educate themselves about these issues, and if you support them, to sign the petitions and volunteer to collect signatures to place them on the ballot.
