Not long ago, I visited a Jewish man in prison a few weeks after Passover. He told me how he was able to get matzah and that his seder consisted of him eating the unleavened bread in his cell, while singing 'Dayenu' and reciting to himself the prayers and parts of the Exodus story that he was able to recall. He told me, despite his long sentence, the holy day experience helped him to feel incredibly liberated, as if he himself was moving from bondage to freedom. He had achieved, at least for the time being, a sense of inner freedom, even as it would not be possible for many years to be released from jail. This understanding helped this man deal with the notion that while spiritual, imaginative freedom has the potential to be limitless, yet responsibility-individual and societal-necessarily puts some limits on our physical freedom.

Freedom is wonderful, but it has limits. Because we live in society with others, we are not actually free to do anything that we want. Even so, many in this country feel pretty incredibly free when it comes to our movements, activities, and expressions. Yet, there are still voices in this country that claim programs such as governmental taxes and regulations make us less free, voices that seem to ignore the link between freedom and responsibility.

That link is very strong in our Jewish tradition. On the second night of Passover, Jews traditionally begin a 'count up.' We add a number each successive night until we reach 50, and that day is the festival of Shavuot. Now, Shavuot is nowhere near as popular as Passover, but the counting means they are inexorably connected. At Passover time, seeds are planted; on Shavuot, in the early summer, the crops begin to bear fruit. Passover is the time to celebrate the liberation story in our Torah;

Shavuot marks the part in the same story (according to tradition, 50 years later) in which the Torah is revealed. Torah, with its ten commandments, with all of its laws, rules and regulations regarding how we treat and take care of one another, teaches us how we can support the vulnerable, embrace the stranger, and level the playing field.

Responsibility without freedom is slavery, while freedom without responsibility is chaos. Neither way is desirable, what is needed, as always, is balance.

And so, we arrive at Passover in the springtime, our hearts filled with hope and renewal. At our seders (please see inside the MEMO for a listing of all our wonderful and diverse seder opportunities), we hope to increase our sense of inner liberation, freeing ourselves from the behaviors and feelings that can enslave us. We also must remember that for some people, unlike the man I visited, through no fault of their own-physical freedom, is still not a full reality. In far off lands and right here at home, in ways large and small, there is still a need for liberation, and bringing more freedom to more people is yet another responsibility for those of us who are able.

I have certainly thought about that prison visit each and every Passover since it occurred. Before I left him, we prayed together, for his spirit to remain as clear and pure as the Passover in jail had left it. We counted the day together as well, the new day that brought him and all of us closer to the union of freedom and responsibility. That is the goal of our lives and of the world.

Any time is the right time to take a deep breath! Why are you here? Keep it in perspective!

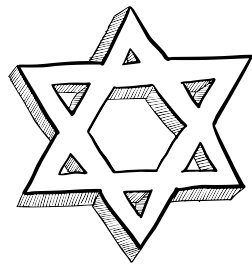
