## *Let's Go Diving...No Previous Experience Necessary*

I recently met with a man who said, "I want to talk with you because my life is falling apart." "How is your life falling apart," I asked. He proceeded to tell me his story. He is unhappy at work, his job may be in jeopardy, and his wife wants a divorce. We all know someone in these very difficult situations. It may even be us at times. And despite the man's pain, he was surprisingly optimistic. He said, "I have the feeling that somehow, a year from now, I will be happier and on the other side of this chaos." When I asked him how I could help, he paused, and said, "I'm so afraid of the next year -- all that I have to go through with my wife, and children, and maybe my job." Then he cracked a smile and said, "Can you 'fast forward' me to a year from now?"

I would like nothing more than to "fast forward" this man, and many others, for that matter, who are going through challenging life transitions. Wouldn't it be amazing to be able to fast forward through life's difficult moments so we don't have to pay attention to and deal with our painful and troublesome circumstances?

In the retail world, everyone loves a bargain. We love to get our "stuff" on sale. Maybe we are also looking for a similar sale in the emotional and spiritual worlds. If only we could "fast forward" through the difficult moments and come out OK on the other side. The only problem is our

knowing that there are no sales in the emotional and spiritual departments of our lives. We have looked in many places for such sales, only to find that we actually end up paying more in emotional, spiritual, and often literal dollars.

Jewish tradition teaches that the way out of a difficult life experience is to go through it. One of the clearest examples of this occurs when a loved one dies. In the rending of our garments, we feel more deeply our torn hearts. As we shovel dirt on the casket we hear the sound of finality. And when we cover our mirrors, we are encouraged to stay in our mourning and not be distracted from it. All of these practices are designed for us to enter fully into the experience, as a way to get through the experience. The wisdom is to go through it not around it -- no shortcuts or fast forwards. And when we fully enter into it, we actually get through it easier than if we avoid or shortcut.

Jewish tradition also teaches that our High Holidays do not begin with Rosh Hashanah. Our holidays actually begin an entire month before during the month of Elul. The rabbis suggest and encourage us to take time during the month of Elul to prepare for the work of High Holidays -- looking back at the past year, seeing what worked well and what didn't work so

## Childcare

### OVERVIEW

We offer childcare for children of member households during the Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur morning services. Childcare will be provided by trained caregivers under a congregant's supervision. Please fill out the reservation form on page 8 and send it to us by September 1. We ask for a contribution of \$15 per child per session.



### ARRIVAL TIME

Starting times for services are listed on the previous page. Bring your children to childcare at least one half hour before services to help them adjust to the setting and to allow orderly check in.

### RESERVATIONS

We must have your reservation before September 1. We cannot guarantee spaces for children whose forms arrive after that date. Licensing requirements specify the number of children a childcare provider can supervise. To assure that we have sufficient childcare providers, we can not provide drop-in care for children for whom no reservations were made--NO EXCEPTIONS.

### BEHAVIOR AND COMFORT

Our goal is to provide a safe and fun-filled childcare environment. The staff will work with the children to help them adjust. We do, however, reserve the right to call parents out of services if a child cannot be comforted or managed successfully within one-half hour. Parents are asked to provide us a cell phone number and to set their cell phones to vibrate mode.

### SNACK

We will provide graham crackers and apple juice. If your child needs a special snack, please bring it with you and give it to care providers.

On the 21st of Elul, we gather in the Oneg area to greet CRC's new members, visit with old friends, and enjoy a little wine and cheese.

At 10:00, after a short Havdalah service, we enter the Sanctuary for S'lichot, a holiday that always falls on the Saturday night before Rosh Hashanah.

Traditionally, the service includes prayers of repentance. CRC's S'lichot is enhanced by the beautiful music of CRC's High Holiday Choir. In addition we throw our schmutz away in a large bowl of water, light candles, and exit in silence. In this way, S'lichot opens the process of reflection and t'shuvah which will continue through the High Holy Days and end with the joy of Simchat Torah a month later.
