Movements are Messy, Just ask Moses (a love letter to my CRC family...)

In the story of the Exodus it was when the plagues finally hit home and his first born son lay dead before him that Pharaoh finally let the people go.

He had to suffer the desperate grief they had known.

The people with privilege had to know suffering to be drawn into the story of change as God was drawn in by the groaning of the slaves.

Pharaoh, whose very name means the great divider, felt his and their pain as one and for a moment, he let them go.

But Pharaoh knew human nature and he said to Moses before we left:

“Beware of the evil that will go before your face.”

Beware of the evil that will continue to challenge you;

The evil that comes from fear, from greed, from the need to make me great by making you less.

The evil of blaming and shaming and revenge.

The evil of hate.

The evil of the hardened heart that tends to forget where we have come from and who we are meant to be. That forgets that the only gift of slavery was to know that we must never do to others what was done to us.

And Pharaoh was right.

Again and again, we would be blinded by the evil before our faces and we would complain that there was no food—but then by God’s grace there would be manna.

We would complain that there was no meat - and from love there would be quail.

There was no water - and the well of Miriam would open.

That there was no justice - and we would receive the torah.

And evil would come before our faces again and again as we pushed forward to have a home where we could be free and we would have leaders to remind us that our children deserved more.

In spite of ourselves - we would be reminded that we could do and be better and we remembered Pharaohs challenge and we promised again and again that we could not do to others what was done to us.

That we would not shame because we were shamed.

That we would not blame because we were blamed.

That we would not make anyone other because we were once outside of the tent.

That we would not take revenge because with revenge the cycle of violence never ends.

That we would see the face of God in every one and pray that they would see it in us.

That we would feed the hungry and house the homeless and free the prisoners whose crimes were being poor or black or brown - free them from the lucrative profit systems of mass incarceration that have been built on their backs as the new Jim Crow.

That we would pay a living wage and make

sure that every worker was treated with dignity and there were jobs for those able to work.

That we would keep our land open to the refugee and the immigrant and the stranger seeking refuge from the oppressor.

That we would have a healthcare system that defies disparities and is a right for the sake of all.

That there would be regional tax bases that would not let the quality of public education be solely dependent on one's neighborhood.

That there would be less gun violence because there are fewer guns and common sense laws.

That we would be making it easier to vote not harder.

That we would say no to the creation of more toxic wastes and fuels that pollute our bodies and our air and our water and land because our health is our wealth.

That we would clean up the toxic waste sites like Westlake now and not wait for another generation to suffer.

That we would root out the systems of white supremacy that allow for some to have privilege over others because until all are free, none can be free and until there is justice, there will be no peace.

That it is possible to have security for Israelis and justice for Palestinians and ultimately two peoples living in peace.

As you know, I have been targeted and threatened by those who do not share these values from both the extreme left and the extreme right. The support and love that I have received from CRC, many in the Jewish community and our interfaith community of friends has been humbling and has strengthened my resolve to not be bullied to choose sides. I am committed to supporting the movement that demands that black and brown lives matter and I believe that I can be pro-Israel and defend the right of Israel to exist, pro-Palestinian and believe that Palestinian self-determination is also a right, and that supporting these narratives is also what it means to be pro-peace.

I will never be able to thank you enough for creating a community that can handle the and/ and responses to parallel narratives and the courageous, nuanced conversations about the hard messy task of making the world a more loving, more compassionate and more just place not for some-- but for all.

I really do love you. Thank you.

A MESSAGE FROM ESSIE

Who is wise? One who learns from everyone. (Pirke Avot 4:1)

At CRC, we learn about and promote what Rabbi Susan calls "Radical Hospitality." In Religious School, reflecting CRC Core values, we strive to help our students not just get along with each other, but to appreciate and value the differences that appear in their fellow students, the Jewish people and the greater world.

An Anti-Bias philosophy of education seeks to "educate and empower" students, staff and families to appreciate human diversity, identify unfair treatment and take action against unfair treatment (stand up for what is right). Judaism calls for active participation in Tikkun Olam. Included in these responsibilities are teaching children: to recognize and question stereotypes, and to fight injustice.

With these statements to guide us, we facilitate a learning environment that teaches and supports: positive self-esteem and group identity, active participation, and the importance of questioning.

Some Anti-Bias Educational Goals: (from Jewish Every Day)

- Children should feel pride, not superiority; about being Jewish.
- We are all made in God's Image – B'Tzelem Elohim.
- All people are important and deserve respect – Kavod
- Appreciate what all people share that makes us human.
- Everyone has feelings.

What tools do you need to fight injustice in our world? What tools do children need to question what is unfair? Where do we obtain those tools?

I invite you to think, question and start a conversation about how to provide the needed tools and training to become active participants in Tikkun Olam.

**FEBRUARY SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY SHABBAT WITH DR. KB FRAZIER**

Friday, February 12, 7:30 pm

In Hebrew prayer and song, including the Psalms, the term *Selah* is often used at the break of a passage as a call to the reader to "stop and listen" before moving to the next passage. Bend the Arc's *Selah* Leadership Program is widely recognized as the pre-eminent leadership training program for Jews working in the social justice sector. It trains a cross-section of leaders in Jewish, non-Jewish and secular organizations to be effective, sustainable and collaborative agents for change.

CRC's own KB Frazier was selected as one of only 22 people across the country to participate in *Selah* 14 Cohort, which supports the leadership of Jews of Color. At February's Social Responsibility Shabbat, we will be given the incredible opportunity to hear about KB's recent experience and how CRC can continue to work toward being a supportive space for all Jews. For example, while the American Jewish community is multi-racial, there are few Jews of Color in positions of prominent leadership within Jewish organizations and few Jewish programs dedicated to specifically serving their needs. We can do better.

KB is a freedom fighting queer, trans Jew whose mission is to dismantle racism and eradicate poverty. By day, KB is the chief audiologist at a local nonprofit and loves helping people hear better through education, diagnostics and hearing aid dispensing. Over the last year, KB has become a drum major for justice leading actions and protests for change in and around Ferguson, MO. KB serves on the boards of the Missouri GSA Network and Central Reform

Congregation. KB is currently a cohort leader of the Amir Cultivating Justice STL Project and is a part of the 14th cohort of the *Selah* Leadership Program.

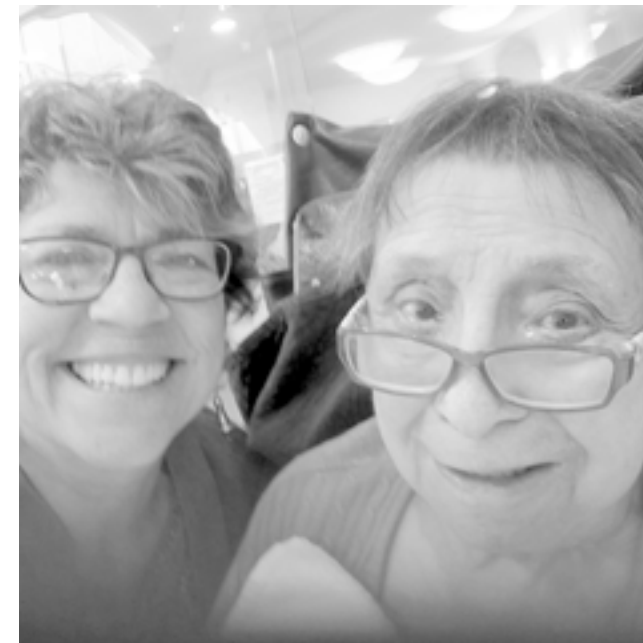
BLESSING BUDDIES SYLVIA NISSENBOIM AND CLAIRE JACOBS (BY SYLVIA NISSENBOIM)
