Have a Dream

A few years ago, I was in Memphis to participate in the wedding of Rabbi Dan Bogard (who grew up at CRC) and Rabbi Karen Kriger. Amy and I spent Shabbat morning at the National Civil Rights Museum. This amazing, powerful dream come true was built into the façade of a nightmare—the Lorraine Hotel, site of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Outside the building, there is a smallish plaque of dedication, easy to overlook, from the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. For some reason I stopped right in front of it and read the words. Inscribed were MLK's birth and death dates, and his role as the founding president of the SCLC. And then, words from the biblical book of Genesis: "They said to one another, 'Behold, here comes the dreamer, let us slay him. Then we shall see what becomes of his dreams!'"

I had to look a few times. Those words, detailing the conspiracy of Joseph's brothers, were from the Torah portion of that very Shabbat as I stood there. I read it again as if I was in shul, listening to chanting from the scroll.

Why do we kill dreams, and sometimes even slay the dreamers?

Dreams and dreamers intimidate us because they shake us out of our comfortable routine. But, when we let them, dreams can point us to a better future. The biblical Joseph's dream, about the large and small cows helped Egypt ward off a devastating famine and feed the entire region. Dr. King's dream articulated the need for integration and racial justice to be major goals of our society.

Thankfully in the Torah story, Joseph's brothers did not fulfill the worst of their plans. Joseph's dreams matured along with him, and ultimately they saved the lives of his family and our people. Tragically, the forces conspiring against Reverend Martin Luther King Jr. did end his life, and we will never know all of what he would have taught us and all the places he might have led us in the many years that should have been his and ours.

But even so, the dreams of justice and love he told us about in his too short life have led to a national holiday in his honor, a newly unveiled monument in Washington DC, and most importantly, progress for our nation and for all humankind.



Please join us as we continue an amazing tradition of celebrating Dr. King and the future of his dreams with our brothers and sisters of Cote Brilliance Presbyterian Church. This year, it is CRC's turn to host the service, on Wednesday, January 11, at 7:00 pm. The emphasis will be on the sweet and inspiring music we can make together when Dr. King's dream of all of us sitting together at the table of brotherhood is fulfilled.

Report from the URJ Biennial

CRC was well-represented at the 71st Union for Reform Judaism Biennial in Washington, DC December 14-18. Rabbi Susan Talve, Jennifer Fishering, Jen Bersdale, CRC Board President Janet Rodgers, Philip Deitch, and Steve Friedman joined 5,000 staff, clergy, and lay leaders from congregations across North America to connect and learn together.

Jen Bersdale led a session called Who are the People in Your Neighborhood? Finding Social Action Partners in Your Community. Jen joined three other experts to share what they know about social justice advocacy and community partnerships. Her invitation to present and the well-attended session are reminders that CRC is at the forefront of tikkun olam and social justice advocacy. CRC is fortunate to have so many wonderful members and community partners that help drive our efforts to make the world a better place.

Jennifer Fishering went to the URJ Biennial specifically with the goal of learning more about what other

congregations are doing for young professionals and young families. After attending seminars and sharing with staff from other congregations, she has a fresh outlook on programming for young professionals and young families at CRC. Look for new and improved programs like Tot Shabbat in the coming year!

Janet attended seminars on temple leadership and demographic trends in reform Judaism and shared experiences and ideas with temple presidents from across the country. We participated in the largest Shabbat dinner in the history of the world (they think) and heard from Ehud Barak, Barack Obama, Natan Sharansky, Ted Olson, and David Boies, among others.

All CRC attendees have returned eager to evaluate how we do our jobs, if we can improve, and what ideas we can implement from the URJ Biennial.

Bouyed by a profound and unfaltering motherly love--both in his memory and in the arms of his adoptive mother--he ultimately finds an identity and a happiness all his own.

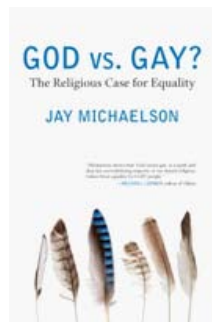

Jay Michaelson Comes to CRC

The myth that the Bible forbids homosexuality — the myth of “God versus Gay” — is behind one of the most divisive and painful conflicts of our time. In his new book *God vs. Gay?*

The Religious Case for Equality, scholar and activist Jay Michaelson shows that not only does the Bible not prohibit same-sex intimacy, it honors the values of love, justice, diversity, and compassion brought about by equality for sexual minorities. Michaelson argues that religious people should support equality for gays and lesbians not despite their religion — but because of it.



This event will include a conversation with Michaelson about *God vs. Gay* and an opportunity to ask questions and share views on this highly contentious and important debate.

**Classes meet on Fridays, 5:00 - 7:00 pm
(No classes on December 23 or 30)**

We'll all meet in a big room with lots of tables and at least two teachers. Students will progress at their own rate by working with a partner(s) that is/ are on their level. We will provide a guided framework and mini lessons. You hook yourself onto our scaffold at whatever point you need to be. We'll probably run something like twelve weeks on and three off for the whole year - but that detail depends on how many of you show up and on your feedback.

Since it will be a lab setting, you can, of course, be “late” and still fit in.

No matter what level you are, there will be teachers there to help you work on your Hebrew. Folks that are beginners will meet for the first several lessons as a group and will get more intensive direction. If you know the first six consonants, a couple of vowels, and understand how to break a word into syllables, you will move into the more self-assessing, self-moving class. People who already know the whole alef-bet will work on materials that start you on translating prayers and grammar.

On January 6, we're starting a class for REAL beginners (can't tell the letter Shin from a Sigma). We ask that you commit to being there for six weeks. After that... REAL beginners will go on a waiting list. Everyone else please come as usual and we will continue in a lab setting.
