Triple Chai Plus is alive and Well! and ...the Boomers are Back! (and India here we come!...)

As we approach our thirtieth year many of us have been reflecting on where we have been and the wonderful opportunities before us. I recently had the opportunity to address the Triple Chai Plus group; a social group that meets around topics meant to engage our seniors (60ish plus..yes that's me, too!) by building relationships, making connections and providing opportunities to learn and serve.

The people who come to the meetings have many interests and are very interesting themselves. Many of us are part of the Baby Boom generation and a little older. I invite everyone to join this wonderful, growing and dynamic group that is adding to the energy and quality of life at CRC.

Our sheer numbers changed the face of America and we may be on the verge of doing so again.

Almost nine months to the day after the end of WWII, many of us were born. After sixteen years of depression and war, when many had postponed marriage and children, the years 1946-1964 added 40% to the population. People had children with the hopes that the future would be one of comfort and prosperity and in many ways they were right because the sheer numbers grew the economy. Labor unions promised good wages and benefits; and the GI bill, that made it possible for white Americans to buy

houses, grew the suburbs. By the 1960s suburban boomers and our parents were 1/3 of the population of the US and everyone seemed to be happy with their "Frigidaire." But we know better. The Vietnam War with it's draft, the civil rights movement, and the women's movement took the veil off the 50's illusions and released the boomers with our visions of a different way of living upon society. Betty Friedan described the feminine mystique as the suburbs burying women alive. The boomer daughters responded with a rebirth of the feminist movement.

But we were also conditioned by the post war economy and the growth of the middle class. We discovered credit cards and charge accounts and the manufacturers and marketers had their eye on us as potential shoppers. We had to have mouse ears and hula hoops and Frisbees and Barbie dolls and records...all those records. Life magazine called us a "built in recession cure." Today we are paying the price with an economy that is dependent on us buying lots of stuff we just do not need and an environment that is suffering from non-recyclable waste and pollution. But we know better. And our kids know better. The "echo-boom", the 20's and 30's of the NextDor generation are responding to the values we spoke about even if we did not always live them. They are working for Teach for America and for

We have resources and skills that can be used to make our lives and our community and our world better! By mentoring, volunteering, becoming involved again and by just connecting to each other our presence will be felt and the next generation will know that they are not alone.

Each program will include popcorn and a discussion facilitated by a CRC rabbi. Looking forward to seeing you at the movies!



January 12 - THE EXPERIMENT

When Hurricane Katrina hit New Orleans, it destroyed the lives of hundreds of thousands of people. But when the flood waters finally subsided, many more problems were unveiled, including a disastrous school system, but instead of rebuilding a broken system, the city decided to try something new. The result was a radical change in education in New Orleans that some say is the model for education reform across the country and around the world. The film examines the public school v. charter school debate through the eyes of those it affects most. It also poses questions that no one seems to be asking: Is this a great experiment or school privatization? And are these changes ultimately in the best interests of the children of New Orleans?

February 16 - TWO MILLION MINUTES

Regardless of nationality, as soon as a student completes 8th grade, the clock starts ticking. From that very moment, the child has approximately two million minutes until high school graduation. Two million minutes to build their intellectual foundation. Two million minutes to prepare for college and ultimately career. Two million minutes to go from a teenager to an adult. How students spend this time - in class, studying, playing sports, working, sleeping, socializing, or goofing off - will affect their economic prospects for the rest of their lives.

This groundbreaking documentary takes an in-depth look at how students in the United States, India, and China are spending their two million minutes. Following two students from each country, the film creates a global snapshot of education through the eyes of students preparing for their future. It also addresses what the differences in time allocation in different countries will mean for the 21st century global economy.

March 23 - A CLASS DIVIDED

The day after the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in April of 1968, students in Jane Elliot's third grade class in a small, all-white Iowa town were confused about why anyone would kill Dr. King. In an effort to teach her students what discrimination feels like and what it can do to people, Elliot divided her class into blue-eyed and brown-eyed groups. One day she treated the blue-eyed group as the superior group with the brown-eyed group being inferior. The next day she switched. What she saw, and what the students learned, was astonishing. This is the story of that lesson, its lasting impact on the children, and its enduring power thirty years later.

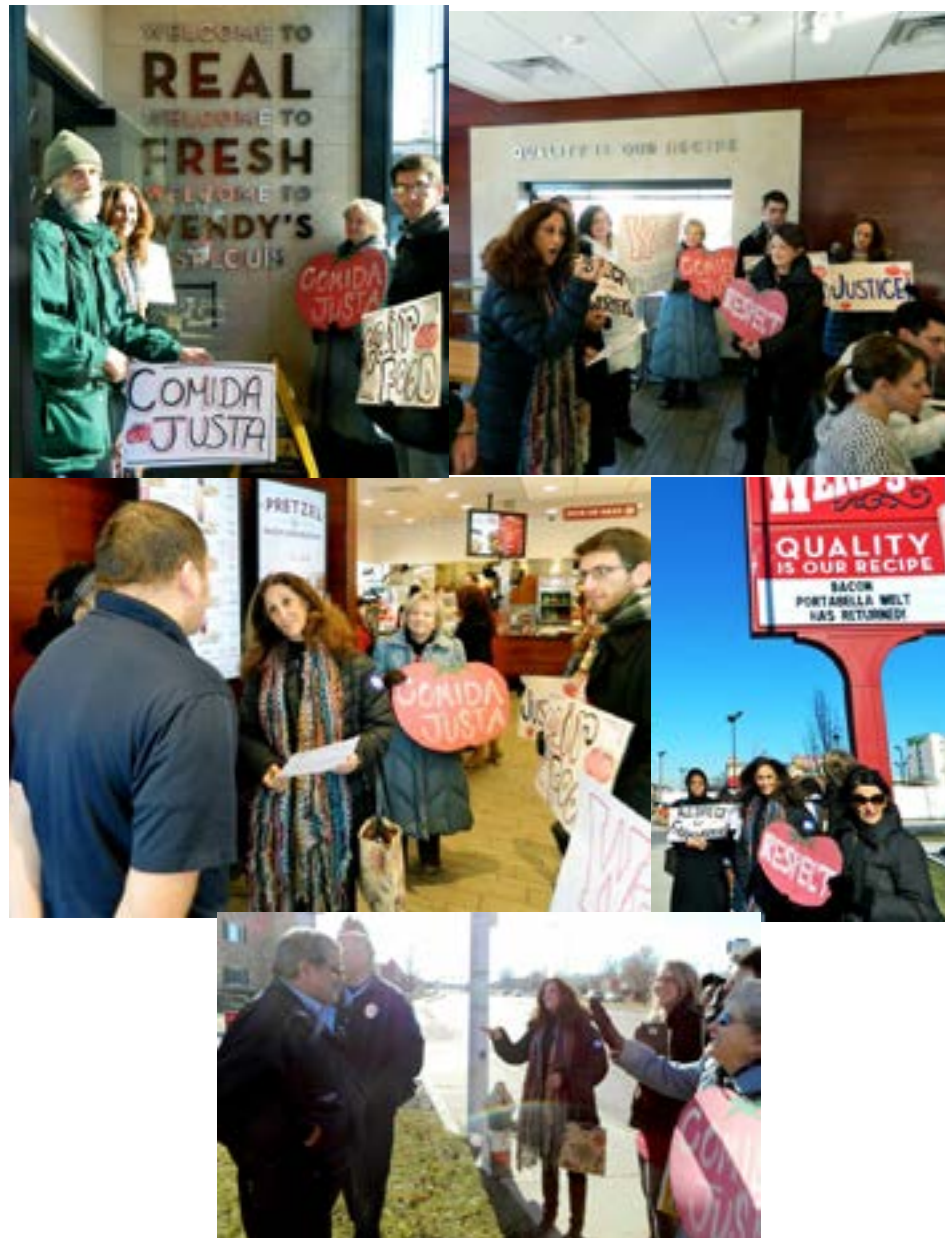

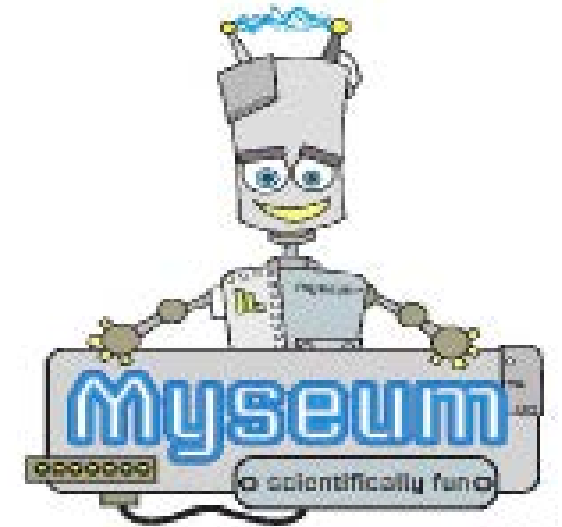
