## B'midbar - In the Desert

We left for Israel on our amazing congregational journey the day after Shabbat B'midbar, the Sabbath in which synagogues around the world began reading the biblical book that means 'in the desert.' Then we spent our first full day in the Holy Land in the Negev Desert. This did provide a wonderful spiritual backdrop

Bedouin tribe, who make their full-time home in the sandy wilderness. They provide a link to the very beginning of our collective conscience--Abraham and Sarah in robes, sandals, headdresses, and the ethos of hospitality. For them, navigating the desert is not a throughway, it is the destination.



to those narratives of our wandering ancestors we started to hear the day before, but geographically speaking, if you're going to be in Israel, you're eventually going to spend time in a desert anyway, as it is an eco-system that covers 80% of the country. Yes, there are marvelous cities, ocean and lakes, mountains, and lush farmland. But you can't travel far without being 'b'midbar.'

However, the other desert stories we heard more closely mirrored the Torah trajectory of wandering through the challenges of wild places in order to settle a home, Promised Land. We visited the urban kibbutz of the African Hebrew Israelites, originally Black Americans who reclaimed the Torah spirituality that they believe was one of the traditions prevalent in Africa and stripped away by the slave masters.

Early on, we met with members of the

This group left Chicago in the late 1960's and purposely stayed for two years in the Liberian desert before arriving in Israel. It is their belief that their time in the wilderness as nomads was a necessary preparation to permanent settlement.

Then there was Adina, an Israeli who came from Ethiopia 30 years ago. She told us about the incredibly difficult months spent struggling in the endless sands of Sudan before being dramatically flown to Israel. She laughingly related to us that a few years later, her sister was able to come directly from Ethiopia without the treacherous trekking. While the sister to this day tells Adina that it was worth the wait not to have to go through the trials, Adina reported that she always answers that going through the desert first as she did was more 'legit,' more like the Exodus stories that the sisters heard as girls in their rural synagogue.

Despite the relentless sun bearing down on the shadeless scene,

there is something rather exhilarating about the ownerlessness, ruggedness, and endless windswept expanse of the desert landscape. 'Midbar' also means speaking in Hebrew, and my time there truly spoke to me, giving me perspective and inspiration.

Though one aspect of summer is fun in the sun, this is also a long, hot, dry season. Growth appears to be temporarily stunted, and the renewal and bounty of the New Year seems far off in the future. In our tradition, summer brings the mourning day Tisha b' Av, and we will gather at CRC on Saturday night, July 28 at 8:00 pm and navigate the desert within. The hope is that this b'midbar moment too will bring clarity and renewal.

Our group eventually left the desert and ascended toward the highest and greenest parts of Israel. Yet, like those who came before us, we carried our b'midbar time with us as a teacher, guide, and imprint on our souls.
