Holy Transformations - Journeys to Positive Change and Growth

I was talking to a young man the other day who told me the most powerful story. He said that he was at Yom Kippur services at the Chase last year and the theme of forgiveness just clicked with him. For years he had a very chilly relationship with one of his parents and in this moment of community, introspection, and worship he made up his mind to make things better. He went directly to that parent and apologized for his part in the rift and though this man did this without expectation, the parent reciprocated. There they sat; crying, hugging, catching up and now they are well on their way to a much healthier relationship.

It is reminiscent to me of one of the more emotionally compelling Torah narratives, the story of Judah, Joseph's brother who helped throw Joseph in a pit and sold him to strangers for twenty pieces of silver. Years later, Joseph who is physically unrecognizable to his brothers as an adult and part of the Egyptian elite, is amazed how much Judah himself had (spiritually) changed. Judah had become a nurturer, a protector of his young brother Benjamin; this was a Judah who seemed far removed from the person who once had so shockingly little regard for family love and loyalty. This transformation leads to a breathtaking scene where Joseph reveals himself to Judah and the other brothers, with tearful forgiveness and a renewal of long-lost loving bonds all around.

It is worth noting that the Jewish people received our very name from this same biblical

character named Judah. We can claim that Judah's journey to positive change and growth is written into our own present day identity as Jews. How can we have similar holy transformations in our own character and relationships? Certainly we can make a determination to make this happen at any time, but there is a season within the Jewish calendar that emphasizes that opportunity, and that season is arriving soon. Some call this period yemei t'shuvah, the days of transformation.

And, though it is the grand day of t'shuvah, and one that clearly provided my friend with the inspiration he needed to affect change, this season that increases our awareness that such change is possible is not Yom Kippur alone. Starting with the month of Elul (this year beginning in early August), the tradition encourages us to reflect on where in our lives forgiveness and reconciliation are needed. According to tradition, every day of this month is a day to hear the shofar call stirring our conscience. On the day of Slichot (this year, the evening of Saturday, August 31, probably much too early this time to mirror nature's changes and the turning to fall colors) just before the new Jewish year, a day which literally means forgiveness, we are hopefully ready to commit our well-intentioned thoughts into actions and make this season truly one we will remember as having made a difference in our lives.

TISHAH B'AV

Monday, July 15, 7:00 pm

We meet for fellowship and our service for Tishah b'Av, the fast day that comes on the ninth day of the month of Av. Traditionally, Tishah b'Av remembers the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem, our metaphor for ultimate sadness and loss. At Passover when we conclude each year with "Next Year in Jerusalem," it is with the hope that the Temple will be rebuilt, the exile will end, and that our lives will again be whole. Many liberal congregations ignore Tishah b'Av because, as liberal Jews, we do not base our faith on the rebuilding of the Temple and the return to Zion, nor can we relate to the hot dry cycle of the land that occurs at this time of the year. Parctically and theologically we have made a commitment to making our lives whole and healthy in communities all over the globe as well as in Israel.

At CRC, we have reclaimed this holy day as an essential part of our holy day cycle. Just as we cannot accept the responsibilities of the freedom that Passover brings without first having the fun of Purim, so we cannot be ready for the hope and joy of a New Year without doing the work of ultimate mourning and letting go of the sadness of loss on the Ninth of Av.

On Tishah b'Av we are asked to face our greatest fears and our greatest sadness as a community so that we may continue the work of our healing and, each year, be ready at Rosh Hashana, to begin at a higher, less painful, more conscious place.

SECURITY

Please avoid carrying large purses, satchels, book bags, etc. into the Khorassan Room. An officer may ask to check your bag; your cooperation and understanding will be appreciated.

CHILDCARE**Overview**

We offer childcare for children of member households during the Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur morning services. Childcare will be provided by trained caregivers under a congregant's supervision. Please fill out the reservation form on page 8 and send it to us by August 19. We ask for a contribution of \$15 per child per session.

**Arrival time**

Starting times for services are listed on the previous page. Bring your children to childcare at least one half hour before services to help them adjust to the setting and to allow orderly check in.

Reservations

We must have your reservation before August 19. We cannot guarantee spaces for children whose forms arrive after that date. Licensing requirements specify the number of children a childcare provider can supervise. To assure that we have sufficient childcare providers, we can not provide drop-in care for children for whom no reservations were made--NO EXCEPTIONS.

Behaviour and Comfort

Our goal is to provide a safe and fun-filled childcare environment. The staff will work with the children to help them adjust. We do, however, reserve the right to call parents out of services if a child cannot be comforted or managed successfully within one-half hour. Parents are asked to provide us a cell phone number and to set their cell phones to vibrate mode.

Snack

We will provide graham crackers and apple juice. If your child needs a special snack, please bring it with you and give it to care providers.

On the 21st of Elul, we gather in the Oneg area to greet CRC's new members, visit with old friends, and enjoy a little wine and cheese.

At 10:00, after a short Havdalah service, we enter the Sanctuary for S'lichot, a holiday that always falls on the Saturday night before Rosh Hashanah.

Traditionally, the service includes prayers of repentance. CRC's S'lichot is enhanced by the beautiful music of CRC's High Holiday Choir. In addition we throw our schmutz away in a large bowl of water, light candles, and exit in silence. In this way, S'lichot opens the process of reflection and t'shuvah which will continue through the High Holy Days and end with the joy of Simchat Torah a month later.
