Learning Life's Lessons for the Long Term

After the holiday of Shavuot, the climax of our story when we receive our guide for living a moral life -the Torah, the cycle of our holy days slows us down. The heat of the summer demands a different pace but we still have a choice. We can let the lessons learned on our journey save us and deliver us to a better place or we can forget them and make the same mistakes again. We can let the experiences change us and push us to rise above the challenges of daily living or we can resist and stay stuck in the wilderness with no hope of peace.

I can feel myself resisting. I remember the promises I made to myself when I first fell and I couldn't move. "I am going to exercise, eat better, and not be so busy." I was determined. Crises, large and small, get our attention. On the mountaintop, in that moment of revelation, things seem so clear. Then we get better, or the mourning period is over, or our lives go back to normal and that precious fleeting moment when transformation was possible is lost to the regular routines and comfort zones of our lives.

But the point of our holy days, our rituals, our practices and our learning is not just to inform it is to transform. It is to help us hold on to those hard learned lessons and let them change us for the better. Our practices are the fitness course for living that prepare us for the experiences in our lives that are beyond our control, the sickness, the disappointments, the losses, and the deaths that turn our hearts inside out and change the course of our lives.

Jewish tradition, teachings, rituals and holy days prepare us for these most challenging times that we will not just survive but grow from them. Here are a few of the lessons I have learned on the journey:

- **★** There are no short cuts. The only way from the narrow place to the promised land is through the wilderness.
- **★** The importance of imagination. Imagination allows for something we have not considered before to open the window when a door closes.
- **★** The importance of developing one's concentration. Concentration helps us be in the moment and as mindful as possible.
- ★ There is always something to be grateful for. The mother of a 19 year old who recently died told me that when her daughter was little she took her to a house that was broken down and over grown. The mother was about to turn around until her daughter pointed out a beautiful white rose that was growing at the side of the house. "She taught us to to see the white rose even then, and I am trying to find the white rose now, when I need it the most."
- ★ And in the words of Hava Polinsky, quoting both her father and Yitzhak Pearlman, for anything worthwhile, "practice slowly." Building one's strength, one's skill, one's wisdom, takes time and patience.

After Shavuot the summer holy days give us a time to mourn the destruction and loss in our lives with the fasts of the 17th of Tammuz and the 9th of Av. But then Elul comes to prepare us for a New Year when we dare to hope again for a better year and a better world. Last summer brought us Occupy and tent movements of people demanding an end to the

May the practice of our faith and our traditions prepare us to respond to the challenges we can control as we:


- **▼** Support our efforts to protect and promote affordable health care access for all.

LGBT Equality in Missouri, 2012: The Good, the Bad and the Uqly

Guest Speaker: Andrew Shaughnessy, PROMO

As members of an inclusive holy community at CRC, it's often easy to forget that members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) community in Missouri still struggle with a lack of basic rights and protections. In most of the state, it is still legal to fire someone just because he or she is gay. Youth are regularly bullied in school because of their actual or perceived sexual orientation or gender identity, and too few receive the support they need from adults at school to combat the bullying.

The past year has seen exciting gains in the number of St. Louis County municipalities protecting the LGBT community from discrimination, with more progress expected on the horizon. At the same time, the Missouri legislature considered a bill in 2012 that would have put LGBT youth at even greater risk of bullying and isolation in school. The bill didn't pass, but sponsors are already promising to file it again next year.

At Social Responsibility Shabbat, Andrew Shaughnessy of PROMO will speak to us about both the good news and the frightening news in the movement for equality for members of the LGBT community, and will tell us how we can help. Please join us for an informative and inspiring program.

Huge Crowd Turns Out for Quilt Blitz for The Covering House

More than 175 community members turned out on Saturday, May 19 for a "Quilt Blitz for The Covering House." CRC members planned the Quilt Blitz in partnership with individuals from First Unitarian Church, The Journey Church, Kirkwood Baptist Church, and Emerson Unitarian Universalist Chapel.

The event was attended by a broad range of faith and secular groups across St. Louis to create handmade quilts as a gift for girls in need.

Participants worked in teams of 4-15 individuals on log cabin quilt tops, which volunteers will turn into finished quilts for girls at The Covering House. Each girl who comes to the house will get to select her own quilt, which she will take with her when she leaves the program as a reminder of the support she has from the St. Louis community.

A broad range of faith and community groups made up the 27 teams of quilters at the event. Teams came from CRC, First Unitarian Church of St. Louis, the Dominican Sisters, the Islamic Foundation of St. Louis, Kirkwood Baptist Church, Harmony United Methodist Church, St. Alphonsus Rock Church, The Journey Church, the Thimble and Thread Quilt Guild, and many other formal and informal groups. In addition, dozens of volunteers from CRC worked throughout the day to make the event a success.

The Covering House will open the first shelter in St. Louis for girls under the age of 18 who have been trafficked or sexually exploited. The FBI has said that St. Louis is a hub for this activity, and there are currently no resources for girls who are rescued. At the event, Dedee Lhamon, Founder and Executive Director of The Covering House, shared that earlier this year, there were five teens rescued within a five-week period in the St. Louis area.

In addition to the quilts, the event featured a raffle to raise money for The Covering House, door prizes for participants, and a spread of food donated by quilters and volunteers.

The Quilt Blitz was held at the union hall of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, which donated the use of their hall to the event. Union members stayed after their Friday night meeting to set up for the event, many working until after midnight to prepare for the multitude of sewing machines, ironing boards, and fabric cutting stations required to put together more than 25 quilts.
