Passover: A "Cinderella" Story

My family visited Disney World for the first time over winter break. Though our teen-aged daughter reminded us that she was well past her 'princess phase,' she did have us all wait in line to have her picture taken with Cinderella. Now this was the royal version of Cinderella, of course, elegant and bejeweled, far from her far more humble and difficult beginning.

In the story, Cinderella is at first overworked and undervalued, an oppressed and despised step-sister. The fact that her journey eventually led her to great heights turned her tale into a catchphrase—any rags to riches narrative can be deemed a "Cinderella story."

Though completed centuries earlier (Cinderella began life in a 17th Century Italian folk tale), the Hagaddah follows such a trajectory. The telling of our Passover story is supposed to begin with degradation and end with praise. We read, "My father was a wandering Aramean" and know the story gets even worse than that before it gets better. We trace our roots not only to homeless trekkers, but to slaves who are, as author Julius Lester, an African-American Jew writes, "considered the equal of a table."

Moreover, on Passover we are urged to embrace that part of our identity, to not make a separation between our vulnerable ancestors and ourselves. "Avadim Hayinu," the Hagaddah teaches, "We were slaves." Reflecting on this annual affirmation, Rabbi Michael Lerner writes, "No wonder that the constant

recounting of our struggle has predisposed Jews to support the liberation of other oppressed groups." Passover serves to remind us that the proper response to people who are marginalized in our society is not to be indifferent or to add to their pain, but rather to be empathic allies.

This attitude is so important to our CRC values of inclusion, social consciousness and radical hospitality that we want to make sure there are many ways to experience Passover. As part of our University Series, I will be teaching about the ancient roots and modern branches of Passover, as well as a seder workshop, on the first three Tuesdays in March from 7:00-8:30 pm. The fourth Tuesday in March coincides with our annual community second seder, always a spirited and liberating evening (see reservations information on page 4). Following that are four (of course there are 4 more!) unique Passover gatherings (from the perspective of women, men, the LGBT community, and Jewish racial diversity), each helping us live like we remember where we came from.

At the end of the Passover seder, the ritual is to direct our attention to the door, which is to be left open to welcome Elijah the Prophet. The legend is that before he died, Elijah declared he would return each Passover in the guise of a poor or oppressed person. By the treatment he would be given, Elijah would know how humanity is doing in our mission to

Terrell Wooten Receives JPro Award

CRC's Building Manager Terrell Wooten was presented with the JPro Dedication Award at the 8th Annual JPro Recognition Luncheon on January 31. The award is presented annually to a staff member who consistently demonstrates assistance, dedication and effectiveness to colleagues and their organization. JPro is an association dedicated to supporting professionals working at Jewish organizations in St. Louis through training and networking opportunities. Following are the introductory remarks by Executive Director John Terranova in introducing Terrell.

"While he doesn't talk about it, we at CRC know that he regularly spends time caring for his mother, or granddaughter, or cooking for a family get together. He is a single parent lovingly raising a teenage son.

"*Dedication* – to devote oneself to some special work or action. For 12 years Terrell has devoted himself to the mission of CRC and the community, a mission that we at CRC certainly consider special work. I know that I speak for the rabbis, members and staff of CRC when I say we are privileged to know and work with Terrell every day."

CRC's 9th Grade Class Takes Washington, DC by Storm!

Nineteen members of CRC's 9th grade class traveled to Washington, DC last month, accompanied by Rabbi Ed, Jen Bersdale, and three parent chaperones – Janet Rodgers, Cheryl Adelstein and Brad Hartman.



The students spent the school year studying social justice issues and preparing to lobby on Capitol Hill. This year, the students chose to lobby for marriage equality, preventing gun violence, and protecting anti-poverty programs in the federal budget. On Friday, February 15, the students shared their thoughts on these issues in the offices of U.S. Senators Claire McCaskill and Roy Blunt and U.S. Representatives William Lacy Clay and Ann Wagner. While most of the legislators were out of town, the group of students who lobbied in Rep. Clay's office got to meet with the congressman himself, a very memorable experience.

In addition to lobbying, the students saw many of the sights of Washington, including the Smithsonian, the Holocaust Museum, the Supreme Court, the Newseum, Ford's Theatre, and the monuments. We also met with a group of representatives from the National Coalition for the Homeless, who shared their personal stories about struggling with homelessness, and did a service

project with the Religious Action Center for Reform Judaism.

Finally, on Sunday, we traveled to the National Mall for the Forward on Climate Rally, the largest climate action rally ever held on the Mall. We didn't stay long due to extreme cold and wind, but we did have a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to get a teaching from Rabbi Arthur Waskow, a national Jewish environmental leader, see the rally, and watch part of the march to the White House.

The students who went on this year's trip are an incredible group of young adults who represented CRC and the Reform Jewish Movement well. We hope their memories of this trip stay with them as they continue to grow as individuals and a class.

Digging Through History: Archaeology and History from Atlantis to the Holocaust

Digging Through History is an illustrated lecture based upon the new book by Rowman and Littlefield of the same name. It begins with one of the oldest archaeological mysteries, the ancient city of Atlantis, which disappeared after a major cataclysmic environmental disaster, to one of the newest archaeological mysteries, excavating an extermination camp abandoned during the Holocaust.

The lecture will feature why the Dead Sea Scrolls and the excavations of a church in Medieval Spain show us a perspective on religion, archaeology and history like no other. Dr. Richard A. Freund, the Maurice Greenberg Professor of History at the University of Hartford and Director of the Maurice Greenberg Center for Judaic Studies at the University of Hartford is the Director of six different projects in Israel, including Qumran, the Cave of Letters and Nazareth, as well as excavations in Spain and Poland. He is the author of eight books, including *Digging Through The Bible*, and *Digging Through History*, and has appeared in 15 television documentaries on biblical archaeology, including The History Channel's *God vs. Satan*, CNN's *After Jesus: The First Christians*, and National Geographic's *Finding Atlantis*.
