## What's So Great About Purim?

The Rabbis tell us that when Adar approaches, our joy increases. As we say goodbye to the winter months, we look forward to the spring where the world reawakens around us. And during this time of rebirth, we begin to look forward to the holiday that turns the world on its head: Purim.

Purim is a festival of joy, of laughter, and yes, even of silliness. We wear costumes and eat sweet foods, celebrating Esther's victory over the evil Haman (boo). We read the story of Esther, who stood up for her community and courageously faced those who would seek to destroy her and her people to boldly ask her husband, the King, for mercy and compassion.

Purim is a holiday of joy, yes, but it is also a festival of bravery, sacrifice, and self-awareness. It is a holiday that demands that we take an active role in shaping our own destiny. No longer can we wait for God to step in and save the Jewish people; we, ourselves, must engage in the act of salvation. God's name is notoriously absent from the Book of Esther, pushing us to rethink and reframe God's role in our lives. How is God both present and also hidden in our lives? How can we bring forth divinity and holiness in places where God's presence is not always evident?

This year, we are adding a new event to our already incredible Purim lineup. **On Saturday morning, March 19th, we will be hosting an inter-generational congregational learning program called "What's So Great About Purim? Understanding the Whole**

**Megillah" to help us think about the questions that Purim asks us.** We invite everyone, at every age and stage of life, to join us for an abbreviated Shabbat service at 10:00 am, and then to participate in our Purim program from 11:00-12:30. Our Education Steering Committee has been hard at work creating opportunities for lifelong learning and engagement for every member of the congregation during this event. Together, we will make hamentaschen and assemble mishloach manot baskets (gifts for our community members and those in need). We will push ourselves to engage in questions surrounding the "politics of Purim," considering how Esther would face some of the tough situations in which we find ourselves today. And, together, we will think about the customs and traditions of what Purim looks like in 2016.

Of course, we always look forward to our Purim Carnival put on by our 7th grade students on Sunday, March 20th, 1:00 pm-3:00 pm, and to our Purim spiel on Wednesday evening, March 23rd at 7:00 pm, as we witness Esther finding her voice.

We invite everyone to come and experience the joy, the laughter, and the silliness of Purim, to answer the important questions that we face at this time of year, and to understand, once and for all, "what's so great about Purim!" We hope to see everyone there!

**ADVOCACY ROUND ROBIN**

*Saturday, March 5, 12:30 - 1:30 pm at CRC*

Now that we have tackled and passed Advocacy 101 with flying colors, it is time for us to take that extra step and dive deeply into some important issues. Two of the issues we plan to focus on for the next few months are the Voter ID bills and the Missouri Non Discrimination Act (MONA) that are currently making their way through the Missouri Legislature.

For those unfamiliar, this is the 9th attempt to implement unnecessary and unduly restrictive ID requirements for voting since the Missouri Supreme Court ruled it unconstitutional in 2006. The main objective of a law requiring voters to show a government issued ID is not to prevent voter fraud (which doesn't actually exist outside of "The Breakfast Club"), but to marginalize the poor and minorities.

Did you know that in Missouri, lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender people can be fired from their jobs, evicted from their homes, and denied access to public accommodations and services? MONA aims to prohibit discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity in the workplace and at restaurants, hotels, and other places of accommodation. MONA would simply extend the existing Missouri Human Rights Statute to include lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender (LGBT), and allied people.

We are excited to bring two amazing speakers on March 5 who will help us better understand each topic. Denise Lieberman, Senior Attorney at The Advancement Project, CRC member, and daughter of Joy Lieberman, will speak about Voter ID. Kirstin Palovick, a Field Organizer at PROMO, will present about MONA.

### BLESSING BUDDIES CHERYL FRANKFATER AND ROSE MASS (BY CHERYL FRANKFATER)

Being a blessing buddy fulfills a need I didn't know I had: to be a granddaughter again. I was paired with a remarkable woman named Rose Mass. Rose worked as a secretary in a legal firm before getting married (to her boss, and there's a romantic story about how he proposed) and had 4 boys. She then went back to school to receive her masters in social work, and worked in family therapy until she was 70. It's pretty inspirational stuff for someone like me, trying to relaunch my career after having just one boy.

The times I've met with Rose, only three times so far, I've taken my son Aaron, aged six. He makes a useful calling card with his youthful energy, big brown eyes and round face. He is more memorable to Rose than I am. So we are working to find things that the 3 of us like to do in her apartment. Perhaps a board game? Today Rose and Aaron played tic tac toe for a while. That said, I enjoy having conversations with Rose that Aaron doesn't necessarily have the patience for. I just have so many questions. What was it like to raise 4 boys? How did you handle the challenges or did you even find it challenging (as I would)? In your work as a family therapist, how did you get families to overcome negative patterns and replace them with healthier ways of relating?

I was worried that sometimes my visits would be an imposition, but I haven't gotten that feeling. This visit, since I needed to get a photo, I took my ipad, and was also able to share some pictures of my family, like my parents playing scrabble and photos of Aaron driving a small electric tractor.

This isn't the first time I visited an elderly person who isn't family but feels like family, and I still am not good at consistency. I allow work and other pursuits to get in the way. It is a gift, though. I can't really explain why. And it feels like it's meant to be.
