## A Group with No Name....Yet

Let's face it. There is just no good word or phrase for getting older. As many of us age we sometimes try on the different labels that have been given to our section of the population. Am I an "Elder?" Some are uncomfortable with even a small amount of reference to getting older. How about, "Elderly?" I am too young to be elderly. Am I a "Sage?" That doesn't appeal to the ones who are older and don't feel particularly wise. Am I entering, "Old Age?" Who wants to embrace that description no matter what age we are? The Hebrew language is not much help here, either. The word for, "Elder" is *Zakein*, which is the same word for "Graybeard." This description is just not inclusive enough for obvious reasons.

Then there are what I call the reframing descriptions - "60 is the new 40." Sounds good at first, and yet, every one of us who is 60 and beyond knows the limitations of such a description. And then, there is my father, of blessed memory, who lived to age 96. One day I asked him how he was feeling. "I'm not feeling that well, but it beats the alternative." While I was initially amused by his response, I knew there was something more than just beating the alternative. One of my teachers, Reb Zalman Schachter-Shalomi wrote about such alternatives in his 1997 book, *From Age-ing to Sage-ing*. He describes the amazing emotional and spiritual growth that is now possible for all of us.

So, what can we do? There is a wonderful story in Exodus in which Jethro, Moses' father-in-law, sees how hard Moses is working. Jethro says, "This thing (the hard work) that you are doing (all by yourself) is not good. You will wear yourself out. It is

too heavy for you and you can't do it alone." Moses is able to incorporate the support, guidance, and wisdom of his father-in-law, and get some help for himself. And we in the CRC community can offer similar support, guidance, and wisdom for one another.

I have had a number of meetings with individuals over the past few weeks who have expressed an interest in forming a new group. If you are 55 and older, or younger and feeling drawn to this group for whatever reason, I invite you to the first meeting of our new group with no name, yet. You could be single, married, divorced, widowed, a parent, grandparent, soon to be, or not ever. In true CRC tradition, this group is very open. We will come together and share our stories, our struggles, our wisdom, and our visions. We will also share our questions. What is it like to be at this point in my life? Am I where I thought I would be? Maybe our questions are even the ones the Beatles asked. "Will you still need me, will you still feed me when I'm 64?" Come join us for this new beginning. We will meet on Sunday, May 20, 2012, 9:30 - 11:00 am at CRC. And who knows, we may even come up with a name for our group.

## Lag BaOmer Campfire

Wednesday, May 9, 9:00 pm

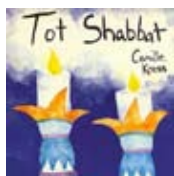
The period between Passover and Shavuot is called the omer during which we ritually count each of the fifty days. The 33rd day is called Lag BaOmer. Kabbalistic tradition recounts that the great sage Rabbi Shimon Bar Yochai died on Lag BaOmer and that the sun miraculously refused to set until he expired, hence the Chasidic tradition of candles and bonfires on Lag BaOmer



In modern day Israel, Lag BaOmer campfires are pervasive among both traditional and

secular Jews. Tens of thousands of Chasidic Jews make a pilgrimage to Rabbi Shimon Bar Yochai's grave at Mt. Meron, where huge bonfires speckle the landscape. Come to CRC's green space to the west of the parking lot to enjoy such a bonfire and to be part of the creative 'down to earth' Lag BaOmer observance.
