November University Series will focus on an exploration of the many themes built into the meaning and motifs of the Oneg's Zodiac Floor

The holiday cycle suggests that each of the holy days is connected. There can be no Passover without the celebration of Purim and there can be no Shavuot without Passover and the Omer. The floor invites us to enter into the circle dance of these holy days with teachings that inspire and challenge.

As the violence in Israel and Palestine escalates, I am drawn to the floor's images of the summer months of Tammuz and Av that show both the destruction of the ancient temple in Jerusalem and the present skyline of the Dome of the Rock and the Al Aksa mosque on today's Temple Mount. It has been reported that the knife wielding Palestinians are responding to threats to this Mosque; claims that according to the Israeli government and the people are untrue and unfounded. In fact, Jews are not permitted to pray on the Temple Mount and Israelis are not permitted to go there in the fear of inciting violence. The lies about this that are being spread are inciting violence in a people who are already suffering from other oppressive laws and practices. Seeing the Temple Mount on our floor is a statement that we support the policies of honoring the Muslim holy sites.

The summer months lead us through the month of Elul that helps us birth a new year with our prayers of penitence and call of the shofar. The holy mother Hannah is ready to birth something new and on Rosh Hashanah, the new moon of Tishrei, we see Sarah and Hagar, the two mothers,

sharing a third eye with a large red drop filling the space between them. Our artist, Siona Benjamin draws us in with the red drop that is weighted on the bottom, ready to birth something new. Every drop is pregnant and full of release pushing us to find our place in the story and its interpretation; we are challenged to find the balance between the painful and negative blood of the conflict and the blood of their children and the positive bloodline that they share. The red drop is one of many themes present in our floor.

There are many teachings that emanate from the floor that I look forward to sharing in the November Tuesday night series. One that you will notice right away are the many men and women of color depicted that celebrate the many hues of our own community. Another is the signature blue of Siona's work. As a Jewish woman born in Mumbai, she draws upon the Hindu, Muslim, Zoroastrian, Catholic and Buddhist influences of her home. The blue figures tie all of these together as the color of the water, the sky, the blue of the fringes of the tallit and of the outsider. Siona has said that the blue figure is a symbol being a Jewish woman of color who belongs everywhere and nowhere. In solidarity with the stranger who we are told to love over and over because we were strangers and we know the heart of the stranger, the blue makes room for all of us as we hope our Sukkat Shalom, our shelter of peace, does.

It is often through art that our imagination frees us to hope for and dream of peace. Our prayers continue to be for an end to the violence here and there with justice flowing forth for all people.

SHANDA: THERE IS NONE, PART 5: JAMI PROGRAM WITH RABBIS SUSAN AND JIM

Sometimes people need to begin with a safe place to listen and trust.

We begin by opening the door by talking about it.

Each session takes a different approach to essentially the same problem: hiddenness around mental illness.

This chapter: we continue to open up more of a community strategy to penetrate the veil of secrecy surrounding mental illness, and offering up some teachings for living with greater depth, joy, and purpose. Presiding will be Rabbis Susan and Jim, and friends who have been there.

We took the Pledge:

- 1) I pledge to bring someone in. If I light a candle, I will share the light.
- 2) I will be a reminder in every way I can to my family, friends, and community: we have these problems, they are difficult, but there is no shame attached to them and we live in a Big Tent.
- 3) We can live with our problems.
- 4) I pledge to break the *shanda* barrier, which means:
- 5) Talk, talk, and more talk.
- 6) I pledge to remind my community that we are working our problems, that

being secret may be part of the problem, therefore:

7) I will not practice aloneness. I will talk with somebody. I will pick up the phone.

UDGY POTLUCK NON-BOOK CLUB

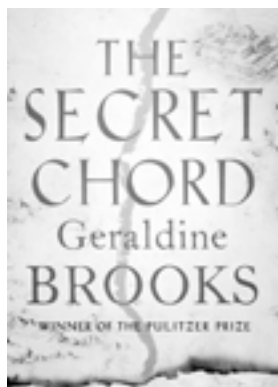
Monday, December 7, 6:00 - 8:00 pm at CRC

In honor of our nation's veterans and in commemoration of Veterans Day and Jewish War Veterans, CRC will recognize those who served our nation in the armed forces. We invite all veterans to join us on this special Shabbat evening.

We are also honored to welcome Rabbi Dr. Jay Goldberg as our Social Responsibility Shabbat featured speaker. Rabbi Goldberg received his ordination at Hebrew Union College in 1963 and his Doctor of Divinity there in 1988. Though all of his accomplishments are too numerous to mention here, some highlights include serving as a pulpit rabbi in Minneapolis, Montreal, and Des Moines, and as the Director of the Pastoral Care Department at Jewish Hospital in St. Louis. Did we mention he is in his 90's and doing fabulously?

Rabbi Goldberg also proudly served his country as a Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps and as a Chaplain in the United States Naval Reserve as a Captain. In 1985, he was appointed by the Chief of Naval Chaplains to be the Readiness Command Staff Chaplain of Region 18 (which extends from Missouri to Colorado), and in 1987, received the Navy Commendation Medal from the Secretary of the Navy.
