CRC Green Team Takes on Becoming Guardians of the Earth

This time of year, after all of the fall holy days have passed, we rewind the Torah and start to read the scroll from the beginning. It's quite jarring to read one portion that tells the story of the world's creation, complete with details of the rich beauty in the natural world, followed by another that tells a tale of all of it being wiped out in a flood.

I wonder if these two myths were strung together as a warning, reminding us of the fragility of the Earth, our shared home. And although Noah's flood came about literally as an act of God, the ancient rabbis understood that it was ultimately our human responsibility to be *'shomrei adamah,'* guardians of the Earth. It is written in the midrash: "Upon creating the first human beings, God guided them around the Garden of Eden saying: 'Look at my creations! See how beautiful and perfect they are. I created all of this for you. Make sure you don't ruin or destroy it. If you do, there will be no one after you to fix it.'"

It is in the name of living up to that responsibility that CRC has joined GreenFaith, a national organization dedicated to helping religious congregations become models of environmental awareness and stewardship. Our synagogue was recently accepted into Greenfaith's two-year certification program. A large and energized group of congregants (Our CRC 'Green Team') has met a number of times to get started on

the many requirements.

Our mission statement is as follows: "We are inspired by Jewish teachings that human beings must be the Guardians of Earth; we must preserve it, not waste its precious resources, and recognize that the natural world is filled with blessings, wonder and delight. Our goal is to bring those teachings to life by raising environmental consciousness in our synagogue membership & in the wider community. We will take action to make our synagogue more 'green' and to leave as light a 'foot print' as possible. In addition, while we acknowledge that environmental problems impact every living being on our interconnected planet, they most imminently bring harm to those whom our Prophets



teach most need compassion and justice, the poor and marginalized in society. It is clear to us that this ecological work is an integral part of so many of CRC and Judaism's core values, including *'tikkun olam,'* the repair of the world, and *'le dor va dor,'* taking responsibility to ensure future generations will share in the blessings we have inherited."

Soon, you will begin to notice some of the first action steps we hope to implement. These come in the areas of stewardship (conserving precious natural resources for sustainability), spiritual life (deeper education and appreciation of nature and ecology), and justice (getting involved

with environmental issues in the larger communities, especially those most vulnerable to environmental degradation). For example, we are ready to make our parking lot a 'no idle zone' (Thou shalt not practice 'idle-latry' for those of you into rabbinic humor), insulate and weather-strip our door sweeps, hold an electronics recycling event, place birdfeeders on our property, create an energy conservation fair, add ecologically themed prayers to our siddur, initiate environmental service projects and field trips for our religious school students, and host a forum dealing with mining environmental health issues in El Salvador. If you are interested in helping with these or other GreenFaith efforts, please do not hesitate to contact me.

In the Torah, Noah was the lone righteous person, only able to save a remnant from the glorious diversity of creation. It is our hope that each one of us becomes a Noah or a Noa, that we enable creation to survive and thrive so that all of us and countless generations to come can live and enjoy.

Making CRC an "Idle-Free" Zone

We know the Ten Commandments tell us not to have IDOLS...but what does Judaism say about letting our cars IDLE?

This time of year we think about the world around us. After all, it is the world's birthday and we want to take care of her. An easy way to perform the mitzvot of *tikkun olam* (repairing the world) and *bal taschkit* (do not destroy) is by turning off your car if you are going to idle more than 10 seconds.

If you idle more than ten seconds it uses more gas than turning your car off and then on again because of today's electronic fuel injectors. For every two minutes a car is idling, it uses the amount of fuel required to go one mile. However, your car is getting zero miles to the gallon.

The average person idles the car for 10 minutes a day, including time at drive-through restaurants and time waiting to pick up passengers. Idling for 10 minutes a day instead of turning off your car wastes 8.9 gallons of gas a year. That's over \$30. It may not sound like a lot, but each gallon of gas puts 19.564 lbs. of carbon dioxide into the air. The extra pollution put out by idling can

cause severe health problems, especially in the young, the elderly and those with asthma and other chronic diseases.

Today's electronic engines do not need to warm up. A car driving will actually warm up about 18 minutes faster than a car idling. Even restarting a car with the air conditioner running is better than letting it idle.



Idling also harms your car. Because the engine is not operating at its peak, fuel does not burn efficiently and this can lead to build up that can damage engine components. The engine will run even less efficiently.

If you drive a hybrid car, your car actually turns itself off when not moving. The rest of us can get this benefit by simply turning off our cars. For every 10 minutes that you turn your car off, you save one pound of carbon dioxide from being released.

If every registered driver in the US reduced their idling by 10 minutes a day, we would eliminate 15.48 million metric tons of carbon dioxide.

As part of our congregational commitment to the environment, we are making CRC an "Idle-Free Zone." This month's *Green Tip*: Please turn off your car when picking up passengers at CRC and elsewhere. You will save money, prevent wear and tear on your car, and protect the planet. What a great way to show G-d we appreciate the world while performing the important mitzvot of Tikkun Olam and Bal Taschkit.
