Yossi Klein Halevi returns to CRC with his new book

Like Dreamers: The Story of the Israeli Paratroopers who Reunited Jerusalem and Divided a Nation is one of the best books I have ever read.

Writer, thinker, teacher and journalist, Yossi Klein Halevi spent eleven years writing this powerful book that gives us insight into the soul of modern Israel by telling the detailed stories of seven paratroopers who liberated the Wall in 1967.

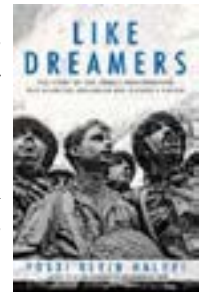
These seven members of the famed 55th paratroopers Reserve brigade helped to liberate Jerusalem, but went on to follow



social and political paths that created the conflicting visions of utopia that continue to divide the nation. This is a deeply personal book for Yossi and for Israel and for anyone who fell in love with the Israel of 1967 and, though we still love her, has been heartbroken by the policies of the occupation.

Over the holidays I promised that we would once again attempt to have courageous conversations on issues facing Israel concerning women's rights, the treatment of Palestinians and about the 40,000 Bedouin who are being forced out of their homes in the Negev.

Let's begin by reading this courageous book together in preparation for Yossi's visit on Tuesday, December 10 at 7:00 pm. There are discounted books available for purchase at the CRC office. It is long, but a great read.



With the inspiration and challenge of the holy days behind us, I look forward to many opportunities to learn together and grow and deepen in our relationships with each other. On Yom Kippur, during one of our breakout sessions we were asked to fill out a card with seven words that described "what makes CRC, CRC?" Many of the words expressed an appreciation for diversity, social justice and inclusivity in a progressive, spiritual, intentional, community. Our plan is to put the cards on our website and invite others to add their seven words. With this and with everything we do, our hope is to be ever re-inventing ourselves, always open to the next big idea, the next new paradigm that will bring us closer to a kinder and more compassionate and more just world for all.
